JOB SUMMARY

Performs duties under moderate supervision. Performs multiple routine or semi-complex tasks with limited exercise of judgment. Assists more advanced employees in the performance of high-level work for development and training. Work is closely monitored and reviewed for accuracy. Responsible for ensuring that all materials of buildings are painted. This includes some prepping and sanding.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

- 1. Sands and preps materials that require painting.
- 2. Repairs any damages to materials prior to painting.
- 3. Mixes paints as per specifications.
- 4. Performs roll brush and spray paint jobs.
- 5. Maintains equipment and spray paint booth.
- 6. Performs other duties as required by job order or assigned by the supervisor.
