JOB SUMMARY: Responsible for maintaining, replacing, or repairing electrical equipment throughout the plant. Extensive knowledge of electrical operations required.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

- 1. Installs conduit.
- 2. Replaces circuit breakers, contactors, disconnects and other electrical equipment as directed by crewleader.
- 3. Repairs electrical saws, vacuums, and other electrical tools as needed.
- 4. Ensures companies electrical meets National Electric Code compliance.
- 5. Performs complex troubleshooting and repairs any problems that may arise w/the electrical systems throughout the facility.
- 6. Performs routine repairs to the AC systems.
- 7. Performs preventative maintenance on equipment and facilities without assistance.
- 8. Maintains the security and controlled access system. This includes cameras, security gate controls, mag-locks, prox-readers, fiber optic modules, etc.
- 9. Reads blueprints and schematics for electrical repair.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS:

Job requires ability to lift up to 20 lbs. frequently and 50 lbs. occasionally (with assistance) when working with electrical equipment and tools on the job. Must be able to carry objects such as ladders or parts from warehouse.

Job requires clarity of vision, with or without corrective lenses. Requires good color determination in identifying different colors of wires.

Job requires working in a various environments. Exposed to such hazardous conditions as extreme noise levels and electrical, automatic, and/or moving equipment.
